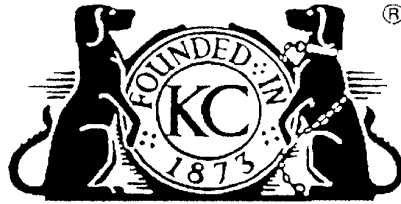


THE KENNEL CLUB



DOG SHOW GUARANTORS DECLARATION

- A. We the Guarantors declare that we are satisfied that the Venue for this event is suitable for a licensed Dog Show and amongst other things we shall provide the following:-
1. Benching, where applicable and unless special permission for the show to be unbenched has been obtained from The Kennel Club.
 2. Judging Rings, which must be appropriate to the number of exhibits and to the breed and shall not in any circumstances be less than 20 feet wide nor contain less than 500 square feet clear floor space. Where there are rings on both sides or rings and benching, the width of unobstructed gangway shall not be less than 6 feet and where there is a ring on one side only, the width of unobstructed gangway shall not be less than 3 feet. Obstruction of the gangways will be prohibited and each ring will be enclosed by seats or otherwise, those occupying the seats will not be considered to be within the enclosure.
 3. At shows where judging is to take place in the open air, an adequate number of alternative rings under satisfactory cover, to provide 2,000 sq. ft. per 150 dogs entered; plans for which will be available for inspection in the Secretary's Office.
 4. Certified measurers for every class where competition is subject to a height limit specified in the definition of the class, for use by the Judge of any other breed if required, (as required by Kennel Club Show Regulation F(1) 4.e.)
 5. Certified weighing machines for all classes where competition is subject to a weight limit specified in the definition of the class. (As required by Kennel Club Show regulation F(1) 4.f.)
 6. An area for the display awards. (As required by Kennel Club Show Regulation F (1) 4.h.)
 7. An area or areas for the grooming of dogs. (As required by Kennel Club Show Regulation F (1)4.i.)
- (NOTE: The use of chalk, powders or any other similar substances is prohibited within the precincts of a show.)
8. Clearly defined exercise areas. (As required by Kennel Club Show Regulation F (1) 4 i.)
 9. Veterinary cover as required by Kennel Club Show Regulation F (1) 13.
 10. A separate place, where water, disinfectant and soap are available for the use of the Veterinary Surgeon and where exhibits can be referred for examination in accordance with Kennel Club Show Regulation F(1) 4.k.
 11. A suitable place in which dogs suspected of contagious or infectious disease can be properly isolated from the rest of the Show in accordance with Show Regulation F (1) 4 l.
 12. A clean water supply.
 13. Toilet facilities of a standard to conform with the requirements of the local Authority. (See Annex B of The Kennel Club Guide to Health and Safety)
 14. A Place where dog boxes and cages can be left (F (1) 4.1. Refers).
 15. Facilities for the cleaning and disinfection of the Show.
 16. Adequate seating accommodation.
 17. Emergency exits and compliance with local authority Fire Regulations. (NOTE: Emergency exits must be kept clear and unobstructed at all times.)
 18. Adequate catering arrangements.
 19. Traffic and car parking arrangements.
 20. Medical arrangements.
- B We jointly and severally guarantee due payment of any prize money in accordance with Kennel Club Show Regulation F (1) 29.
- C We undertake to admit to the Show. members of The Kennel Club General Committee, and the Scottish Kennel Club Executive Council (if appropriate) and Kennel Club Field Officers, on production of their personal passes.

CONDITIONS OF APPLICATION

FOR A DOG SHOW LICENCE

1. The application for a licence to hold a Dog Show must be submitted to The Kennel Club, 1 Clarges Street, London, W1Y 5AB AT LEAST SIX CALENDAR MONTHS before the date of the Show, together with the relevant fee.

2. Application forms received after the due date will be dealt with as follows:-

On the first late submission of a licence application form, the Show licence will normally be issued to the Society but the matter will be referred to the Committee for the possible imposition of a fine.

On receipt of any subsequent late submission of licence application forms, permission to hold the Show will be cancelled, no licence will be issued and the matter will be referred back to the Committee for further consideration.

3. **Licences will only be valid if current Public Liability Insurance covers the Show.** Documentary evidence of this must clearly be on display with the licence of the event.

4. The date of the Show must not be altered without the prior permission of The Kennel Club.

5. A breed or group Society must not be altered without prior permission of The Kennel Club.

6. Two copies of the **Schedule** must be lodged with The Kennel Club when published. In the case of a Championship Show this must be at least three calendar months before the date of the Show. For all other Shows, at least one month before the date of the Show. Within fourteen days of the close of the Show, a copy of the official **Catalogue** for the show, containing a full and correct list of all entries and with all the awards correctly marked must be submitted to The Kennel Club.

7. A notice regarding the Show will appear in the Show Diary published by The Kennel Club
